- A separate registration form is needed for each child for each session. This will help to ensure that children are placed in the appropriate session.
- Each session will be closed when 300 children are registered for that session. If all sessions are filled on Saturday, June 13, the Wednesday, June 17 registration will be canceled. You can print off the Playground and CAP registration form from the website.

Sailing Program, Location: AHDENAH at Kingston Landing Students will sail Laser-Picos (with jibs) either in the Jones River or out on Kingston Bay, depending on wind conditions. The Beginner Class focuses on getting the sailor comfortable in a sail boat. At the end of this class students should have a solid understanding of water safety, knot tying, rigging a sail boat, righting a capsized boat, parts of a sail boat and their purpose, points of sail, and more. The Intermediate Class is where the sailor will reinforce their knowledge of the topics in the beginner class and improve their sailing with the introduction of man overboard rescue, racing techniques and rules, and marked course training, along with having the opportunity for more sailing time.

Students need to bring a Coast Guard approved life jacket, Type III, of correct size and weight for the student, bathing suit/towel, sunscreen, water, sweatshirt or jacket. Classes run Monday – Thursday. Friday will be used as a make-up day if class needs to be canceled due to inclement weather.
